The Florida Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys (CSSBMB) announced Terrell Nelson has been selected as executive director of the Florida Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys. The newly created position is the first for CSSBMB.

Prior to joining the Florida Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys, Mr. Nelson served as an Academic Program Specialist for Florida State University. He received his Bachelor of Science in Sociology at Florida A&M University, Master of Science in Higher Education Administration at Duquesne University and is currently in his doctoral program (Philosophy in Ethical Leadership in Higher Education) at Saint Thomas University.
