 - C. **Announcement of New Council Member-** Senate President Passidomo appointed Senator Shervin Jones to Senate Seat 1 for the Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys. The appointment is effective January 1, 2023, and expires December 31, 2026.
 - D. **Dr. Eddie Regnier Graduate Research Scholarship** - The scholarship has been completely drafted, however, waiting on communication from the contributor and waiting to draft a memo for the non-profit that will be holding the money. The non-profit is called "A New Day Initiative," essentially speaking to the needs of the Tallahassee community in terms of a local-wide food pantry, grant funds to serve the community, garden projects, etc.
 - E. **FAMU Meeting Updates** - Currently waiting to see the facility manager at the university about the meeting space in March. However, a connection has been made with a faculty member that could possibly book the meeting space for the council so the price could possibly be reduced to \$70/hr. rather than \$225/hr.

F. **HBCU Research Tour- First Stop is Florida Memorial University:**

The ED and RC have decided that 2023 will be the year of Higher Education in terms of Black Men and Boys. The two will travel to various HBCUs to discover gaps and disparities concerning the black male population. It is a comparative study, so the team would travel to not only Florida HBCUs but also to the other 15 southern states that house HBCUs. This will ensure an accurate and adequate study for the 2023 annual report.

The goal is to gain 50 partners by the end of 2023.
